Mary E. Parkman of Palmyra in the County of Somerset formerly Mary E. Flanders wife of Henry O. Parkman of Dexter in the County of Penobscot respectfully libels and gives this Honorable Court to be informed that she was lawfully married to the said Henry O. Parkman at Palmyra aforesaid on the eighteenth day of February A.D. 1869 - that your Libelant since their intermarriage has always behaved herself as a faithful chaste and affectionate wife towards him the said Henry O. Parkman, but that the said Henry wholly regardless of his marriage covenant and duty on the first day of October A.D. 1870 and ever since that time wholly abandoned your Libelant and wholly refused and still refuses to provide any means for her support & maintenance - that the disposition and temper of the said Henry and your Libelant are wholly uncongenial to each other, and that their continuance in the marriage relation would only contribute to the unhappiness of both. That she was only thirteen years of age when married to him and has had no children that during the time since their intermarriage till the time of their separation on the first day of October 1870 the said Henry constantly treated her in the most abusive manner by the use of the most abusive language to her -

Wherefore the said Libelant prays right and justice and that she may be divorced from the bonds of matrimony between her & her said husband, as in duty bound will ever pray. Dated at Bangor aforesaid the 24th day of August A.D. 1872 - Mary E. Parkman

This libel was filed in the office of the Clerk of Courts on the twenty ninth day of August A.D. 1872 and a copy thereof with a summons was duly issued against the said Libellee. This action was entered at this term & now the Libelant appears & proves to the satisfaction of the Court that the required notice has been given but the said Libellee though called to come into Court & does not appear but makes

default - it is now therefore considered by the Court after hearing the evidence in the case that the allegations in said bill are true and it is therefore ordered and decreed that the said Mary E. Parkman be divorced from the bonds of matrimony heretofore existing between her and the said Henry O. Parkman.

Charles A. Thompson of Newport in said County, husband of Ann J. Thompson, formerly Ann J. Parth of Skowhegan in the County of Somerset, respectfully files and gives this honorable Court to be informed - that he was lawfully married to the said Ann J. Thompson at Bingham in the County of Somerset on the twenty-sixth day of May A.D. 1870 and has had by her no child or children - That your Lileant since their intermarriage has always behaved himself as a faithful and affectionate husband towards her the said Ann J. Thompson, but that the temper and dispositions of her and your Lileant were and are wholly uncongenial to each other and that the said Ann J. Thompson wholly regardless of her marriage duty and covenant on the eighteenth day of November A.D. 1870 wholly abandoned and deserted your Lileant and then refused and has ever since refused to live with or in any manner to conduct herself towards your Lileant as his wife or to do or perform any of the duties which are imposed upon her by such marriage relation - Wherefore your Lileant pray's right and justice and that he may be delivered from the bonds of matrimony between him & his said wife.
